

As a leader in Rotary, you're among the first to learn about an exciting update to Raise for Rotary, The Rotary Foundation's peer-to-peer fundraising platform. When a Rotary member organizes a Raise for Rotary fundraiser, their club can now earn credit for donations made by nonmembers. This enhancement recognizes organizers for their hard work and encourages them to reach out beyond their Rotary networks for support.

Since the launch of Raise for Rotary in August 2020, more than 1,500 fundraising events have generated more than \$1 million for the World Fund, the PolioPlus Fund, the Disaster Response Fund, and Rotary's areas of focus. The platform is available worldwide in English and accepts U.S., Canadian, and Australian currencies. Additional currencies and language options will be added over time.

Additional benefits of Raise for Rotary include:

Empowering Rotary members

To raise money for The Rotary Foundation, creative members have used a variety of external platforms, but those have limitations. Raise for Rotary is a custom-branded platform that's integrated with our online giving system. This makes it easier to create a fundraiser that supports specific Rotary causes and expands our reach on social media.

Giving donors recognition credit

When people give through Raise for Rotary using the email address they use for other Rotary functions, such as their My Rotary account, they will receive Rotary giving credit and recognition. External platforms make it difficult for us to extend Rotary giving credit, which can lead to frustration and confusion for donors.

Minimizing fees to do more good

External platforms have their own fee structures, rules, and guidelines. With our own platform, we can process gifts more efficiently, which means more of the funds donated go directly toward Doing Good in the World.

Expanding philanthropic opportunities for Rotaractors

Changes to the Rotaract Giving Certificate will give Rotaract clubs more flexibility in earning this recognition for donations to The Rotary Foundation. Beginning this Rotary year, clubs whose members contribute a total of at least US\$100 to the Foundation in a given year will receive the Rotaract Giving Certificate. There is no longer a minimum number of members who must participate, and members of Rotaract clubs can contribute as a group, individually, or by collecting funds through Raise for Rotary. This gives more Rotaractors the opportunity to engage with us philanthropically and to contribute in the ways that are easiest for them.

In 2019-20, 147 clubs earned the certificate and raised \$42,455, and in 2020-21, 225 clubs received the recognition and raised \$66,922. If you have questions about the Rotaract Giving Certificate, please email annualfund@rotary.org.

THE WRITTEN OBJECTIVE FOR THE ROTARY FOUNDATION as agreed upon by 1945-1946 board and trustees

From the 1946 Manual of Procedure

- 1. Rotary Foundation Fellowships for Advanced Study.
- 2. The extension of Institutes of International Understanding in countries where they have not been developed.
- 3. The fostering of any tangible and effective projects which have as their purpose the furthering of better understanding and friendly relations between the peoples of different nations, such as: assisting Rotary clubs in obtaining speakers who can discuss with authority world agencies organized within the United Nations Organization.
- 4. The providing of emergency relief for Rotarians and their families wherever war or other disaster has brought general destitution and suffering.


The Rotary Foundation continues to do "good work" today

WHAT IS THE ROTARY FOUNDATION'S ANNUAL FUND?

The Annual Fund is the primary source of unrestricted support for the programs of The Rotary Foundation. From digging clean water wells for villages in Africa to teaching basic literacy skills to children in Latin America, during any given moment in a day, thousands of Rotarians volunteer their time and expertise to ensure that all contributions given to the Annual Fund are spent wisely on quality Rotary projects.

In the 2020-21 Rotary year, US\$139.4 million was donated to The Rotary Foundation's Annual Fund. The Annual Fund is comprised of donations from Rotarians, friends of Rotary, corporations, workplace giving vehicles and can be matched by corporate matching gifts to leverage your donation. On 21 July, a case of variant poliovirus type 2 (VDPV2) was confirmed, in Rockland County, New York. As the first case of polio identified in the United States in nearly a decade, this demonstrates that until polio is fully eradicated everywhere, all countries remain at risk. Just this past month, WHO and UNICEF released official data confirming the largest sustained decline in childhood vaccinations in approximately 30 years. Increased rates of vaccination will be essential in delivering a polio-free world, and it is more apparent than ever that childhood routine immunization is crucial to avoid resurgence. The detection of polio in New York and drop in childhood vaccination rates represents the urgent need to protect children and communities from all preventable diseases like polio and build a healthier world.

GRANTS RESPONSIBILITIES BY LEADER

Club President

QUALIFICATION

- Complete the grant management seminar or have another club member do so. (Ideally, the president
 will complete the seminar as well as any club member that is planning to apply for a global grant.)
- Read and agree to the <u>Club Memorandum of Understanding</u>.

GLOBAL GRANTS

- Monitor all grant participation in your club. (As a club president, you can view any global grants that are being sponsored by your club in the <u>Grant Center</u>.)
- Authorize the legal agreement for any grants that your club sponsors.
- Authorize reports for club-sponsored grants.

DISTRICT GRANTS

- Work with club members to submit district grant requests to the district.
- · Help implement district grant-funded activities.
- Make sure that district grant reports are submitted to the district.

DISTRICT 7090 FOUNDATION COMMITTEE IS PLEASED TO ANNOUNCE THAT OUR 1ST APPLICATION FOR A DISASTER RESPONSE GRANT FOR UKRAINE HAS BEEN APPROVED!

In collaboration with Not Just Tourists, AMD for Hope, and Niagara Warehouse of Hope, we will be airlifting medical humanitarian aid to Ukraine. Items being sent will include: up to 500 medical trauma kits, prescription medications, 100 boxes of nasopharyngeal airways, decompression needles, and blood administration sets. The trauma kits will include: abdominal pads, sterile eye pads, hand sanitizer, saline, tensor bandages, scissors, nasopharangeal airway, marker, splint (made by the NWOH sewing room volunteers, gauze, cloth sided tape, Tylenol, coagulants, antibiotic cream, analgescis, tourniquets, alcohol swabs granola bar, tongue depressors, saline flushes, specialized drugs, suture+plastic needle driver, sterile gloves, procedure gloves, masks, manual BP equipment, and stethoscope.

Not Just Tourists is a medical humanitarian aid non-profit organization run by Rotarian Dr. Ken Taylor and wife Denise. In 2009, both Paul Harris Fellows, received the Humanitarian Service Award from Rotary International. Not Just Tourists has been operating for 30 years sending medicine and medical supplies to medical professionals in need in over 70 countries in the world. With the exception of some funding from local Rotary clubs, it has relied exclusively on donations of medicine and medical supplies from pharmaceutical companies, physicians, pharmacists and visiting home care professionals. To date we have supplied over \$10,000 (wholesale) to Ukraine of antibiotics and diabetic medicines. In addition, the non-pharmaceutical side of Not Just Tourists has supplied 5000lb of supplies and contributed medical equipment such as hospital beds, rehab equipment, and wheelchairs to three containers which have been sent through the Niagara Warehouse of Hope to Ukraine.



AMDforHope has already sent over 36,000 kg of donated humanitarian aid in three 40 ft. containers by sea and 3 shipments of medicine (over 6500lbs) by air. All safely distributed to multiple medical facilities in 14 regions of Ukraine. We are in direct contact with doctors in Ukraine who send us specific lists of the most urgent medical needs for their hospitals. To ensure the safety of the receivers, the boxes are labelled with codes assigned to each destination and shipped by Polimex Forwarding Group by air through Poland and then transported to Stay Safe Ua (SSU) in Lviv, Ukraine. As the shipment reaches Ukraine, the receivers are informed that the donations are ready for pick up. Each doctor is provided with the exact count of every item sent to them. Shipping and delivery to Lviv are booked in Canada, which allows us to track every step of the logistic route. We work strictly with the doctors we trust and who at least one of us knows personally.

We need volunteer drivers to pick up & deliver donated medical supplies in your area.
